1. Nakba Day Draws Only 2,000 Demonstrators in West Bank and Israeli Arab Towns, Nir Hasson, Jack Khoury, Noa Shpigel, Yotam Berger, Haaretz, May 16, 2018

"Nearly 2,000 people participated Tuesday (May 15) in demonstrations in the West Bank and within the Green Line to mark Nakba Day and to protest the mounting death toll of Gazan demonstrators in the Strip. The Health Ministry in Ramallah noted that 27 people were injured in the West Bank, and one is in grave condition. However, the Israeli military stated that despite Palestinian reports of live fire used by the army in Hebron, the IDF used rubber-tipped bullets."

2. Kairos Statement on Gaza and Jerusalem, Kairos Palestine, May 24, 2018

"If thou seest the oppression of the poor, and violent perverting of judgment and justice in a province, marvel not at the matter: for he that is higher than the highest regardeth; and there be higher than they (Ecclesiastes 5:8). On Monday, May 14, 2018, in Gaza, 60 people were killed and 2771 wounded among crowds walking unarmed towards their villages, from which they had been compelled to leave. They were killed in cold blood and posed no threat to anybody."

"ON BLOODY MONDAY (May 14) this week, when the number of Palestinian killed and wounded was rising by the hour, I asked myself: what would I have done if I had been a youngster of 15 in the Gaza Strip? My answer was, without hesitation: I would have stood near the border fence and demonstrated, risking my life and limbs every minute. How am I so sure? Simple: I did the same when I was 15. I was a member of the National Military Organization (the 'Irgun'), an armed underground group labeled 'terrorist."
