Maryknoll missioners are Catholic men and women who live and work in dozens of countries around the world, usually vith the most impoverished and marginalized communities.

The Maryknoll Office for Global Concerns brings the deep experience and authentic voice of these missioners to debates about public policy in the United Nations, the United States and other governments, international financial natitutions, and the corporate world.

What we do

Our goals are to educate for social ustice, peace and the integrity of creation and to inform faith-based advocacy and action for social, economic and environmental justice.

ights violations, conflict, and environmental destruction. We also serve as aisons for Maryknoll missioners and Affiliates in Washington, D.C. and at the Jnited Nations.

Due to the wide variety of ministries of Maryknoll missioners, our work covers nany issues, but our primary foci are two projects: Faith-Economy-Ecology FEE) and Sustainable Pathways to Peace and Inclusive Global Security SPPS). We give particular attention to the rights and concerns of migrants and refugees, promoting nonviolence teaching globally and within the Catholic church, and mitigating the effects of climate change.

Faith-Economy-Ecology (FEE)

The FEE project aims to transform the fossil-fuel-based economic model and way of life promoted by the industrialized North, especially the United States, toward significantly greater sustainability and social justice. We are doing this by building a strategic alliance of people of faith and secular organizations and communities actively seeking economic and ecological alternatives. Issues that we follow through the FEE project include climate change, trade and investment, food sovereignty and hunger, and corporate responsibility.



Sustainable Pathways to Peace and Security (SPPS)

The SPPS project aims to engage people of faith in building peace through inclusive communities and economies of "enough." We use Maryknoll's cross border experience to reduce fear of the other and to celebrate diversity as a real and enriching contribution to true security, and to encourage the promotion of diplomacy, dialogue and a multilateral approach to solving global problems. Issues that we follow through the SPPS project include peace processes, nuclear disarmament, and migration and border issues.

How we work

We research and monitor these issues, and participate in faith-based working groups and collaborative efforts to learn more and to strategize on effective legislative and educational responses. We travel to Maryknoll locations around the world to gather information, and we share our understanding and analysis at conferences and retreats. We produce several resources available to anyone who is interested, and we're available to speak to or write for church, school or community groups and publications.
